Reason for grant application	Towards the costs of maintaining the churchyard in good condition as a facility open to all members of the

	village. Because this is an open churchyard (meaning people can still be buried there) the full costs of maintaining it in operation fall on the applicant.

The use of volunteers to keep the churchyard mown helps to reduce significantly the costs that would otherwise arise and is seen as beneficial by volunteers towards their own well-being. Maintaining the churchyard in good repair and condition is seen as important to allow those with relations buried in the churchyard who wish to visit to enjoy a properly tended space where they can find peace and tranquillity
