- Discussing arrangements for the Jubilee & Coronation celebrations, and the installation of the commemorative bench on the Barbury.

COLEY HILL CLOSURE

Although the lengthy closure of Coley Hill has been inconvenient, we hope that it will be worth it in the long run. The work is being undertaken in two phases, the first concentrating on the lower part of the hill below New Chapter Farm. This involved upgrading and installing 7 new gullies to collect surface water which connect to a new 130m pipe under the middle of the road. Emergency repairs to a collapsed culvert and upgrades to reduce blockages were also included.

In addition we have asked BANES to deal with the incursion of the banks and land slippage and to check the safety of trees which have the potential to fall into the road. Hopefully the road will be resurfaced at some point! As yet we do not have any further information on timescales for the remaining work.



CRIME/ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

We are aware of some concerns raised on social media regarding criminal activity in the village. The statistics for reported crimes in the Chew Valley show only one crime reported in Hinton Blewett in the last twelve months. The village Facebook group is a useful way of quickly alerting villagers about suspicious activity or anti-social behaviour, however, these messages are not monitored by the police.

It is very important to report any incidents to the police.
